



Ethics Education Workshop

1-2 December 2008
Auckland, New Zealand

Aim: the workshop will focus on methodologies of teaching ethics, with particular emphasis on application and integration of Asia-Pacific ethical knowledge, epistemology and ideas into teaching ethics. The examples will include both medical ethics, biotechnology, public health and environmental issues.

Faculty: The workshop will be led by experienced facilitators in international bioethics education who have worked in the Pacific, and globally at university and school level, and in training many different social stakeholders.

Participants: Up to 50 persons including bioethicists from many countries, teacher trainers, professors, teachers, ethics committee members and educators.

Venue: the UNESCO workshop will take place in Vaughan Park Retreat Center on the North Shore in Auckland. This is a retreat venue in Long Bay, complete with a beach and delicious home-style cooking. It is 15-30 minutes from central Auckland but in the countryside, being next to nature reserves and coastal walks (Venue website: <http://www.vaughanpark.org.nz/>).

Registration: There is no registration fee, however, in general participants should cover their accommodation and breakfast (NZD 67 per night). Participants will be provided with lunch and dinner on 1 December, and lunch on 2 December. Please email to rushsap@unesco.org. A number of UNESCO workshop participants will be attending the GFBR9 in Auckland, 3-5 December, and participants to that meeting will be able to travel there from 5pm on the 2 December.
